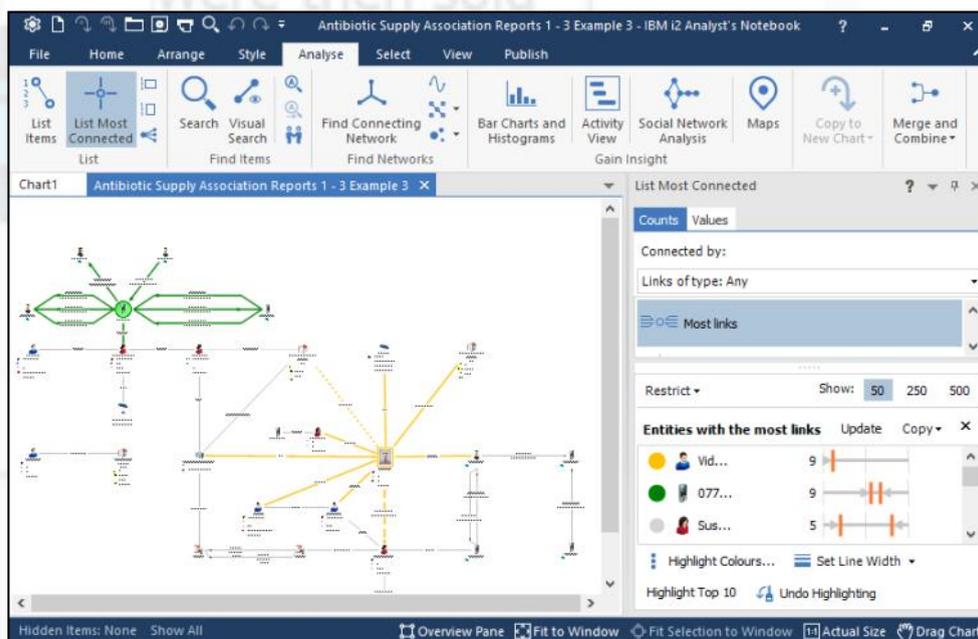

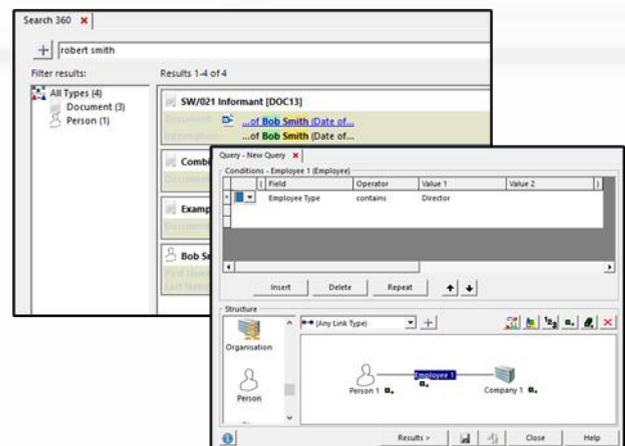

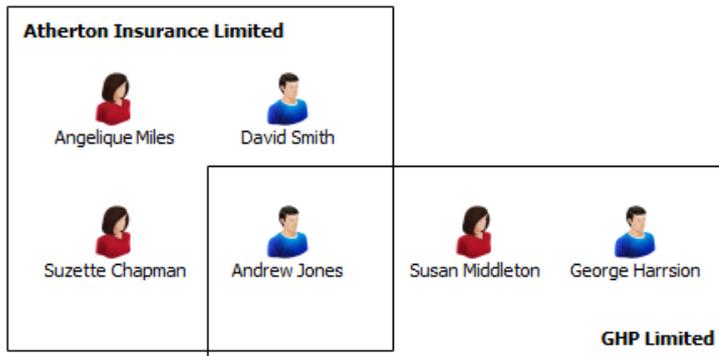

## Analyst's Notebook: Using Boxes

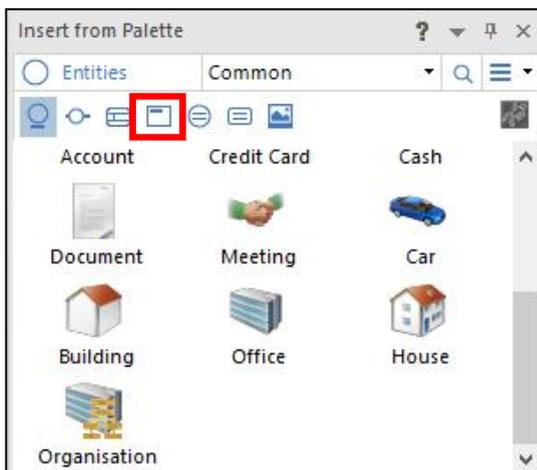
Boxes are often used in presentation or briefing charts to show groups of Entities. They are more visual than using Attributes, and often less confusing than using lots of Links. Traditionally they are also used to show significant members of a company:



You could imagine the boxes above being Organised Crime Groups; or teams of people, such as Suppliers and Dealers.

The Box is another Entity Representation, along with Icon, Theme Line and Event Frame.

To add a Box:



1. Click on the Box Representation
2. Drag the Entity Type you would like onto the chart
3. Edit the Entity, like you would any other Entity

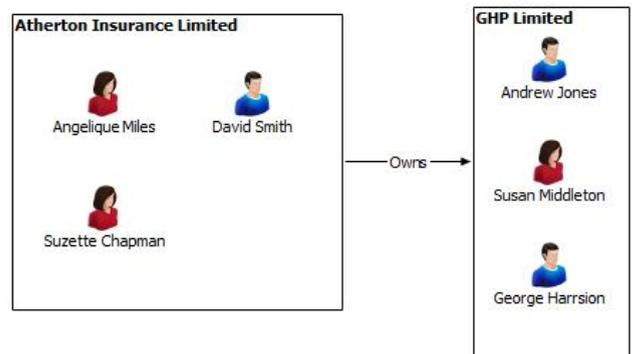
You can resize the Box by clicking and dragging a corner.

To move a Box it's easiest to click and drag the Label of the Box.

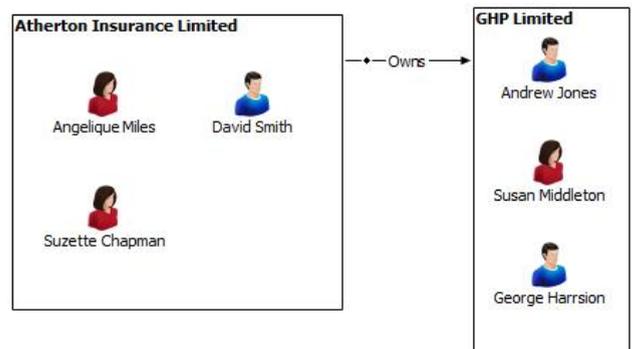
You can move the Box label by holding down the Alt key and dragging the label. As an example you can see the label for GHP Limited is bottom right instead of top left.

To group items on a chart—simply select them and choose Group from the Arrange menu. This is particularly useful with Boxes—Group the Box and the Entities inside—then you can easily move them to a different place on the chart.

Finally—you can Link Boxes—as below:



You may wish to move that Link so it sits in a different place between the two Boxes. Add a Corner to the Link by clicking on Corner on the Home Tab, click on the link. The Corner shows as a small dot (which doesn't print). You can click and drag the Corner and the Link will move:

## iBase: Viewing Links

When an Entity has a lot of Links—the Links dialogue can help you to understand the information in a managed way. On any Entity record either; Right Mouse Click and choose Links ... or click on the records toolbar:



1. Link Summary: Gives an overview by Link Type.

2. Choose a Link Type to see the detail.

3. Link End Summary: Gives an overview of the Linked Entities.

4. Choose an Entity

5. You can see the detail of the Entity

6. You can see the Link (or Links) between the main Entity and the Entity selected at point 4.
